FROM THE PASTOR'S HEART

For anyone who has ever read the book of Job in the Old Testament, one thing becomes abundantly clear—God is always in complete control. In our finite way of looking at situations and circumstances it can seem like everything is spiraling out of control; a pandemic that has taken thousands of lives and has wrecked our economy with lost jobs and business, schools and education thrown into disarray, a divided nation with deadly riots and anarchy threatening major cities, it seems like every day brings more troubling news—yet God remains in control. Job faced tragedy upon tragedy in his personal and business life; the world he knew burned to the ground around him, yet he continued to place his hope and trust in God and God rewarded him. That doesn't mean he didn't face depressing low points, or question why it

was happening—those are common human responses that we all struggle with—what it means is, that when he looked beyond what he could see with human eyes, he discovered a faithful God who never abandoned him. Back in January, no one could have predicted what 2020 held in store for us as individuals and a nation, yet the same God we celebrated and worshiped then, remains faithful and true today. As followers of Jesus Christ our hope remains in the one who brought love, grace, forgiveness and salvation into our lives—not a politician or political party, not a vaccine, not in some hoped for utopia—Christ and Christ alone. God has provided a great opportunity over these last several months for the Church and His followers to examine themselves; our faith, our daily intimate relationship with Him, where we place our hope, and even how we accomplish our mission and calling—my prayer is that we will not waste it.

They don't prepare you in Seminary for Pastoring a church during a pandemic where you must cancel in person worship for weeks on end, where people are confined to their homes and social interaction is frowned upon. Even without meeting in person for worship; we have had families and individuals joining the church, we celebrated baptism and communion, we opened a new door of online worship which allowed us to reach hundreds more than we could ever reach in person and we discovered new ways of reaching out and ministering to our faith community. Thank you for your encouragement, faithfulness, support and sacrifice over these past seven months as it has continued to challenge our staff to dream big, be flexible and adapt and to trust in God moving forward.


With our State still in a "phase 2" of dealing with the Coronavirus, we have put on hold many of our normal Fall activities. Events like Harvest Day, Trunk or Treat and our Wednesday night disciple-ship classes are all on hold until we have further guidance. We continue to see our numbers grow on Sundays for our in-person worship with around 20% gathering here each week and around 80% still worshiping online. We continue to remain sensitive to those of you with health issues that require you to join us online and I want to encourage you to make worshiping on Sunday with your family online a priority until you feel comfortable joining us in person. We hope to allow our Sunday morning small groups and Sunday school classes to start meeting in person in October and our plan is for many of the classes to have an online component so anyone can join in the discussion. We are also in the process of recording and uploading many of our Wednesday night classes from the past year (Understanding the Bible, History of the Bible, This is Us, Financial Peace and Spiritual Gifts) so you can participate and view them from home. These will all be uploaded to our YouTube channel and we will let you know when they are available and complete.

I will be starting a new mini-sermon series this week called "Building Bridges not Barriers" that I pray will give each of us some Biblical insight into how Christians are commanded to deal and interact with many of the challenges we are currently facing. I hope you will join us in person and online for this important series. Like many of you, I have struggled with grieving over not seeing church family and friends during this time but I am praying for each one of you and your families daily. Please continue to let us know how we can minister to you and your families and if there is anything I can do for you, don't hesitate to contact me. May God continue to bless each of you and our faith community called First Baptist Blowing Rock. Rusty

DEACON INFORMATION

One of the ways we have been able to stay in contact with our church family over the last seven months is through our deacon family ministry. When you join the church or attend for over six months, we assign every person to one of our deacons as a part of their deacon family. This allows us to personally minister to each of our families and individuals. If you do not know who your deacon is, please contact the church office so we can put you in contact with them. Our deacon families will be changing in October as we rotate our leadership.

In a normal year, our deacon's rotate off at the end of June from their 3 year term and we elect new deacons to replace them. This year, since we did not have a means to hold a normal election, those 3 deacon's rotating off committed to remaining on the leadership board until we could hold elections. I want to thank Reggie Bray, Lindsey Gough and Hersel Story for their wonderful service to our church and their willingness to serve a couple of months beyond their terms. We now have 3 nominations for new deacons from our nominating committee for consideration by the church and we will have deacon elections on Sunday, September 13th during the morning worship. You will have 2 ways to participate in the election; you can either vote in person by paper ballot during the service or go online to our website and submit an online ballot. We will have a link on the homepage of our website and on our APP for the paper ballot on the morning of the election. At the bottom of each ballot will be a place for you to approve/disapprove the interim budget to run through he end of the year as well. Both of these come to the church by a recommendation from the deacon board. The three nominations for new deacons are; Dave Kinser, Donna Hampton and Rachael Mills.

STUDENT AND FAMILY MINISTRIES

This month we will be studying the life and experiences of Daniel in scripture. Babylon rolled over Judah in three waves of conquest. Daniel and three Hebrew companions—Hananiah, Mishaal, and Azariah—left Judah for Babylon in the first wave, around 605 B.C. (verse 6). In

Babylon, they took their place among other captives (Jewish and other-

wise). As circumstances for captives go, they could have done worse. They had good food and lodging, an elite education, and likely a guaranteed position in the administration after success in their studies. Yet one thing was clear: Babylon expected them to abandon their former beliefs, or at least to make them secondary to what Babylon ordered.

Education, at all levels, remains one of the primary ways to instill culture and worldview in



young people. It is never neutral. It will always be a potent force for transmitting philosophy and beliefs to its students. Babylon explicitly sought to transmit its values through its educational system. We must understand that the educational system we use for our children will seek to mold them into a certain way of thinking and acting. We do well to prepare them for the forces and influences they will meet, especially if it is an unbelieving system.






New Youth Hangout Near the High School

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Operating Checking Account Balance

Our Church budget year ended in June 2020 and considering all the disruptions in the Spring, we finished very well due to the churches continued support and the strength of our online giving options. Thank you for your faithfulness. If you have not checked out our online giving platform, this might be an easier option for you to offer your support. The year end (2019/2020) financial report is listed below and remember that a monthly financial report is always available in the boxes on the wall near the main bulletin boards. You can also find them on our website under documents.

In a "normal" year, we start our new budget year in July with a new proposed and adopted budget but due to the continuing financial unknowns; the Deacon board recommended that the church continue on a "interim" budget that is identical to the one adopted last budget year and we have been operating under this "interim" budget since July. The plan is to continue with this interim plan to allow us to gauge where we are financially and for the finance committee to come up with anew proposed budget for 2021 to begin in January. This needs to be approved by the church body and will be on the new deacon election ballot on September 13th and will also be available online. If you have any questions about these plans, please contact the church office or a member of the deacon body.

We have a very in-depth daily cleaning routine and are sanitizing toys and surfaces daily. Our top priority is to keep our Center a happy and healthy environment for our children to learn and grow in.

Grocery Relief Ministry


Nutritious food can be expensive and difficult for many people to access. Our church body is helping to bridge that gap by simply manning a grocery box distribution point on Thurs-
